Dividing the total number of DBEs by the total number of All Firms gives a base DBE availability figure for each contract. The availability figures for all contracts were then combined and averaged to provide the basis for the three-year overall goal. The base goal projections are as follows:

• Fiscal Year #1 – 9.35%

• Fiscal Year #2 – 15.11%

Average of unweighted availability: (9.35% + 15.11%)/2 = 12.23%

Unweighted DBE Goal at Step 1: 12.23%

Step 2: Adjustments to Step 1 base figure

After calculating a base figure of the relative availability of DBEs, evidence was examined to determine what, if any, adjustment to the base figure was needed in order to arrive at the overall goal.

Past History Participation

Not enough historical data on DBE participation is available to reference to make an adjustment to the Step 1 base figure; therefore, Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport is adopting the Step 1 base figure as the overall goal for this three-year goal period.

Furthermore, there are no relevant disparity studies applicable to Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport's contracting program and market area.

Breakout of Estimated "Race and Gender Neutral" (RN) and "Race and Gender Conscious" (RC) Participation.

Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport will meet the maximum feasible portion of the overall goal by using RN means of facilitating DBE participation.

- 1. Arranging solicitations, times for the presentation of bids, quantities, specifications, and delivery schedules in ways that facilitates DBE, and other small businesses, participation;
- 2. Providing assistance in overcoming limitations such as inability to obtain bonding or financing:
- 3. Providing technical assistance and other services;
- 4. Carrying out information and communications programs on contracting procedures and specific contract opportunities;
- 5. Implementing a supportive services program to develop and improve immediate and long-term business management, record keeping, and financial and accounting capability for DBEs and other small businesses;
- 6. Providing services to help DBEs and other small businesses improve long-term development, increase opportunities to participate in a variety of kinds of work, handle increasingly significant projects, and achieve eventual self-sufficiency;
- 7. Ensuring distribution of DBE directory, through print and electronic means, to the widest feasible universe of potential prime contractors;

Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport estimates that in meeting the established overall goal of **12.23%**, it will obtain 0% from RN participation and 12.23% through RC measures.

This breakout is based on:

Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport does not have a history of DBE participation or over-achievement of goals to reference and expects to obtain its DBE participation through the use of DBE contract goals or a conscious effort to obtain DBE participation. Therefore, the entire goal of 12.34% is to be obtained through race-conscious participation.

Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport will monitor DBE participation on an ongoing basis during the goal period and adjust the estimated breakout of RN and RC DBE participation as needed.

Public Participation

Consultation:

In establishing the overall goal, Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport provided for consultation and publication. This process included consultation with minority, women's, and general contractor groups, community organizations, and other officials or organizations which could be expected to have information concerning the availability of disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged businesses, the effects of discrimination on opportunities for DBEs, and the Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport's efforts to establish a level playing field for the participation of DBEs. The consultation included a scheduled, direct, interactive exchange with as many interested stakeholders as possible focused on obtaining information relevant to the goal setting process, and was conducted before the goal methodology was submitted to the operating administration for review. Details of the consultation process are as follows.

Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport notified stakeholders of the teleconference through posting it on website, sharing it with the chamber of commerce, Department of Transportation, and small business development. The online video teleconference took place on September 29th, 2025 at 12pm CST. There were no attendees, therefore there were no comments.

A notice of the proposed goal was published on the Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport official website before the methodology was submitted to FAA. The notice can be found here: Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport.

If the proposed goal changes following review by FAA, the revised goal will be posted on Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport's official website.

Notwithstanding paragraph (f)(4) of §26.45, Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport proposed goals will not be implemented until the stakeholder consultation requirement has been met.
